## Birding Areas & Highlights

Shingle beaches & lagoons, crumbling cliffs, marshes, estuaries & heathland together make up the beautiful Suffolk Heritage Coast, rightly designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty!

At Minsmere RSPB, Bittern will be possibly “booming”, Marsh Harrier “quartering”, Bearded Tits “pinging” and Cetti’s Warblers singing from the bushes and reedbeds, along with perhaps late wintering Smew & Goosander. On the adjacent Westleton & Dunwich Heaths, Wood Lark and Dartford Warbler commence displaying, with sea-watching off the cliffs at Dunwich producing maybe Red-throated Diver, Slavonian Grebe, Goldeneye, Common Scoter & Sandwich Tern.

To the north lie the Dingle Marshes & Blythburgh Estuary, both highly attractive to wildfowl, waders & raptors inc. Brent Geese, Wigeon, Peregrine, & Hen Harrier, plus Grey & Golden Plovers, Avocet & Black-tailed Godwits, together with the first arriving Spring migrants.

Also visiting North Warren RSPB, Blythburgh Estuary & Southwold, Snape RSPB & Westwood Marshes for more waterfowl & waders.

**It all adds up to terrific early Spring birding!**
